The Youth Ethics Summit will bring together students from across the Puget Sound region to learn about topics related to ethics, medicine, and biomedical research that are of special relevance to young people. This year's summit will focus on pediatric bioethics and will feature clinicians and bioethicists leading discussions on the Ashley X case, the Dennis Lindbergh case, and other cases involving children and young adults. We will also screen a new film, *Citizen Scientist*, which traces the journey of a young patient and her family who seek treatment for a rare disorder in a research study. The Summit provides an opportunity for students from different schools to meet and to participate in discussions and presentations about ethics in science issues.

Each NWABR Ethics in Science teacher will be allowed to recommend up to 5 students to participate. Teachers are also encouraged to attend the symposium. Students whose families are involved with the Institute of Translational Health Sciences or Seattle Children's Hospital may also attend.
