The Clinical Research Support Office Director is responsible for assuring that the research community, including investigators, study teams, and administrators, receive the support they need to conduct outstanding clinical research at OHSU. The director oversees clinical research activities and programs that focus on exceptional customer service, adherence to regulatory requirements, OHSU's mission, risk assessment and mitigation, and operational excellence within a diverse and complex academic medical center.

**Qualifications:** Bachelor's and Master's degree in health administration or related field (or Bachelor's degree and specific related experience as noted in the job posting), plus 10 years' experience in a managerial or leadership position and 10 years' experience in an environment focused on customer service and service excellence. Additional requirements include 5 years' experience with industry-sponsored clinical trials and NIH funded research, 5 years' experience providing clinical research training, 5 years' experience developing policies and procedures, thorough understanding of clinical research processes, and experience implementing electronic systems to support research.

Recognized for being an environmentally conscious city and known for its extensive park system, Portland welcomes outdoor enthusiasts, foodies, and bicyclists. Portland is home to the nation's second aerial tram which connects OHSU's main campus to the South Waterfront campus.

OHSU is the state's only comprehensive public academic health center and has a multifaceted mission that includes excellence in education, research, patient care, and community service.
